BACKGROUND AND HISTORICAL CONTEXT

THE FIGURE OF MOSES IN HISTORY

MOSES IS A CENTRAL PROPHETIC FIGURE IN THE ABRAHAMIC RELIGIONS, CREDITED WITH LEADING THE ISRAELITES OUT OF EGYPT AND RECEIVING THE TEN COMMANDMENTS. HISTORICALLY, MOSES' EXISTENCE AND ROLE ARE SUBJECTS OF SCHOLARLY DEBATE DUE TO THE LACK OF DIRECT CONTEMPORARY EVIDENCE. FREUD'S WORK APPROACHES MOSES NOT ONLY AS A HISTORICAL FIGURE BUT ALSO AS A SYMBOLIC AND PSYCHOLOGICAL ARCHETYPE REPRESENTING THE BIRTH OF MONOTHEISTIC FAITH.

THE INTELLECTUAL CLIMATE OF FREUD'S TIME

MOSES AS AN EGYPTIAN AND THE ATEN WORSHIP

FREUD POSITED THAT MOSES WAS A FOLLOWER OF AKHENATEN, THE EGYPTIAN PHARAOH KNOWN FOR ATTEMPTING TO ESTABLISH THE WORSHIP OF ATEN AS THE SOLE GOD. ACCORDING TO FREUD, MOSES INHERITED THIS MONOTHEISTIC FAITH AND TRANSMITTED IT TO THE ISRAELITES. THIS THEORY SUGGESTS THAT THE MONOTHEISM OF JUDAISM WAS DIRECTLY INFLUENCED BY EGYPTIAN RELIGIOUS REFORMS.

THE MURDER OF MOSES AND THE FORMATION OF RELIGIOUS GUILT

ANOTHER KEY ELEMENT OF FREUD'S THESIS IS THE CONJECTURE THAT MOSES WAS MURDERED BY HIS FOLLOWERS. FREUD INTERPRETED THIS ACT AS A COLLECTIVE TRAUMATIC EVENT THAT LED TO DEEP FEELINGS OF GUILT AND THE CREATION OF RELIGIOUS LAWS AND COMMANDMENTS AS A FORM OF PSYCHOLOGICAL ATONEMENT. THIS MURDER AND SUBSEQUENT GUILT BECAME FOUNDATIONAL FOR THE RELIGIOUS SENTIMENTS EMBEDDED IN JUDAISM.

THE ROLE OF MONOTHEISM IN GROUP IDENTITY

FREUD EMPHASIZED THAT MONOTHEISM SERVED AS A UNIFYING AND AUTHORITATIVE FORCE FOR THE ISRAELITE COMMUNITY. THE WORSHIP OF A SINGLE, ALL-POWERFUL GOD FUNCTIONED TO CONSOLIDATE GROUP COHESION AND LEGITIMIZE SOCIAL ORDER, REINFORCING OBEDIENCE TO RELIGIOUS AND MORAL LAWS DERIVED FROM MOSES' TEACHINGS.

THE PSYCHOLOGICAL INTERPRETATION OF RELIGION

SIGMUND FREUD MOSES AND MONOTHEISM EXTENDS BEYOND HISTORICAL SPECULATION TO EXPLORE THE PSYCHOLOGICAL DIMENSIONS OF RELIGIOUS BELIEF. FREUD THEORIZED THAT GOD REPRESENTS AN IDEALIZED FATHER FIGURE PROJECTED BY THE HUMAN PSYCHE. THIS PROJECTION SERVES TO SATISFY DEEP PSYCHOLOGICAL NEEDS FOR PROTECTION, AUTHORITY, AND ORDER. MONOTHEISTIC FAITH, IN THIS SENSE, SYMBOLIZES THE INTERNALIZATION OF PATERNAL AUTHORITY IN A UNIVERSAL FORM.

THE OEDIPUS COMPLEX AND RELIGIOUS GUILT

FREUD CONNECTED RELIGIOUS GUILT WITH THE OEDIPUS COMPLEX, SUGGESTING THAT FEELINGS OF GUILT ARISING FROM UNCONSCIOUS DESIRES AND CONFLICTS ARE EXPRESSED THROUGH RELIGIOUS RITUALS AND COMMANDMENTS. IN THE CASE OF MOSES AND MONOTHEISM, THE MURDER OF MOSES BY HIS FOLLOWERS CAN BE INTERPRETED AS A SYMBOLIC REENACTMENT OF THESE UNCONSCIOUS DYNAMICS.

RITUALS AND LAWS AS MECHANISMS OF PSYCHOLOGICAL RESOLUTION

RELIGIOUS LAWS AND RITUALS FUNCTION TO MANAGE COLLECTIVE GUILT AND ANXIETY BY PROVIDING STRUCTURED OUTLETS FOR MORAL BEHAVIOR AND COMMUNITY IDENTITY. FREUD VIEWED THESE PRACTICES AS NECESSARY FOR SOCIETAL STABILITY BUT ULTIMATELY ROOTED IN UNRESOLVED PSYCHOLOGICAL TENSIONS.

CONTROVERSIES AND CRITICISMS
