Repeat the process of working three double crochet clusters separated by chain spaces along the sides, and clusters of three double crochets, chain two, three double crochets in each corner space. 1. Make a slip knot and ch 4, join with sl st to form a ring.

4. Repeat round 3 pattern for desired size, adding ch 1 along sides.
5. Fasten off and weave in ends.
