HISTORICAL AND SOCIAL CONTEXT OF ACT 1

ABIGAIL WILLIAMS

ABIGAIL IS A CENTRAL FIGURE IN ACT 1, DEPICTED AS MANIPULATIVE AND VENGEFUL. HER COMPLEX MOTIVATIONS INCLUDE A DESIRE FOR CONTROL AND A LONGING TO RECLAIM HER RELATIONSHIP WITH JOHN PROCTOR. ABIGAIL'S ACTIONS CATALYZE MUCH OF THE HYSTERIA, MAKING HER A PIVOTAL CHARACTER IN THE NARRATIVE.

JOHN PROCTOR AND OTHER KEY CHARACTERS
