IT SHOWCASES BOCCACCIO'S STORYTELLING SKILLS AND HIS INTEREST IN ROMANTIC AND EMOTIONAL THEMES, WHICH ARE FURTHER DEVELOPED IN THE DECAMERON. THE POEM IS AN IMPORTANT PRECURSOR TO LATER RENAISSANCE LITERATURE.

4. *DECAMERON 2.0: CONTEMPORARY TALES OF SURVIVAL AND WIT* BY VARIOUS AUTHORS
