

THE OLD STRAIGHT TRACK ALFRED WATKINS

THE OLD STRAIGHT TRACK ALFRED WATKINS IS A SIGNIFICANT CONCEPT IN THE STUDY OF ANCIENT PATHWAYS AND LANDSCAPE ARCHAEOLOGY. ORIGINS OF THE OLD STRAIGHT TRACK THEORY

THE OLD STRAIGHT TRACK ALFRED WATKINS REFERS TO A NETWORK OF ANCIENT ROUTES THAT WERE BELIEVED TO TRAVERSE THE ENGLISH LANDSCAPE IN REMARKABLY STRAIGHT LINES. HISTORICAL CONTEXT

REMNANTS OF ANCIENT TRACKWAYS THAT HAD BEEN USED FOR MILLENNIA.

CHARACTERISTICS OF THE OLD STRAIGHT TRACKS
