

THE PSYCHOLOGY OF CRIMINAL CONDUCT

EMOTIONAL AND BEHAVIORAL REGULATION

DIFFICULTY MANAGING EMOTIONS SUCH AS ANGER, FRUSTRATION, AND FEAR CAN LEAD TO IMPULSIVE AND AGGRESSIVE BEHAVIORS. EMOTIONAL DYSREGULATION OFTEN CORRELATES WITH ANTISOCIAL CONDUCT AND MAY RESULT FROM TRAUMA OR ADVERSE CHILDHOOD EXPERIENCES.

SOCIAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL INFLUENCES

ENVIRONMENTAL CONTEXTS AND SOCIAL INTERACTIONS SIGNIFICANTLY AFFECT THE PSYCHOLOGY OF CRIMINAL CONDUCT. THESE FACTORS SHAPE BEHAVIORAL NORMS, OPPORTUNITIES FOR CRIME, AND THE SOCIALIZATION PROCESS THAT INFLUENCES MORAL DEVELOPMENT.

FAMILY AND UPBRINGING

PEER INFLUENCE AND SOCIAL NETWORKS

PEER GROUPS CAN REINFORCE CRIMINAL BEHAVIOR THROUGH SOCIAL LEARNING AND PEER PRESSURE. ASSOCIATION WITH DELINQUENT PEERS INCREASES THE RISK OF CRIMINAL INVOLVEMENT BY NORMALIZING DEVIANT BEHAVIORS AND PROVIDING ACCESS TO CRIMINAL OPPORTUNITIES.

SOCIOECONOMIC FACTORS

POVERTY, UNEMPLOYMENT, AND LACK OF EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES CREATE ENVIRONMENTS CONDUCIVE TO CRIME. SOCIAL STRAIN AND LIMITED LEGITIMATE MEANS TO ACHIEVE SUCCESS CAN LEAD INDIVIDUALS TO ADOPT CRIMINAL STRATEGIES AS ALTERNATIVE SOLUTIONS.

KEY ENVIRONMENTAL CONTRIBUTORS TO CRIMINAL CONDUCT

- POOR NEIGHBORHOOD CONDITIONS AND EXPOSURE TO VIOLENCE
- LACK OF COMMUNITY RESOURCES AND SOCIAL SUPPORT
- CULTURAL NORMS THAT TOLERATE OR ENCOURAGE DEVIANCE
- INSTITUTIONAL DISCRIMINATION AND SOCIAL MARGINALIZATION

THE ROLE OF MENTAL DISORDERS IN CRIMINALITY

SUBSTANCE USE DISORDERS

SUBSTANCE ABUSE IS A SIGNIFICANT CONTRIBUTOR TO CRIMINAL CONDUCT, OFTEN EXACERBATING UNDERLYING PSYCHOLOGICAL ISSUES AND IMPAIRING JUDGMENT. CRIMES RELATED TO DRUG POSSESSION, TRAFFICKING, AND OFFENSES COMMITTED UNDER INTOXICATION ARE COMMON IN FORENSIC POPULATIONS.
