CAUSES OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION

MAJOR EVENTS AND BATTLES

THE OUTBREAK OF WAR: LEXINGTON AND CONCORD

THE FIRST MILITARY ENGAGEMENTS OCCURRED IN APRIL 1775 AT LEXINGTON AND CONCORD, WHERE COLONIAL MILITIAS CONFRONTED BRITISH TROOPS. THESE SKIRMISHES MARKED THE START OF OPEN WARFARE AND GALVANIZED THE COLONIAL POPULATION IN SUPPORT OF INDEPENDENCE.

DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE

ON JULY 4, 1776, THE CONTINENTAL CONGRESS ADOPTED THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE, FORMALLY SEVERING TIES WITH GREAT BRITAIN. DRAFTED PRIMARILY BY THOMAS JEFFERSON, THE DOCUMENT ARTICULATED THE COLONIES' GRIEVANCES AND JUSTIFIED THEIR QUEST FOR SOVEREIGNTY.

KEY BATTLES: SARATOGA AND YORKTOWN

THE BATTLE OF SARATOGA IN 1777 WAS A TURNING POINT THAT SECURED FRENCH SUPPORT FOR THE AMERICAN CAUSE. LATER, THE 1781 SIEGE OF YORKTOWN RESULTED IN THE SURRENDER OF BRITISH GENERAL CORNWALLIS, EFFECTIVELY ENDING MAJOR HOSTILITIES.

KEY FIGURES IN THE REVOLUTION

BENJAMIN FRANKLIN

FRANKLIN PLAYED A VITAL DIPLOMATIC ROLE, SECURING FRENCH ALLIANCE AND AID, WHICH PROVED DECISIVE IN THE WAR'S OUTCOME. HIS REPUTATION AS A STATESMAN AND NEGOTIATOR WAS INVALUABLE TO THE AMERICAN CAUSE.

SOCIAL AND POLITICAL IMPACT

THE REVOLUTION SPURRED DEBATES OVER RIGHTS AND EQUALITY. WHILE IT ADVANCED IDEAS OF LIBERTY, MANY GROUPS, INCLUDING ENSLAVED PEOPLE, WOMEN, AND NATIVE AMERICANS, REMAINED MARGINALIZED. HOWEVER, THE REVOLUTION PLANTED SEEDS FOR FUTURE SOCIAL REFORMS.

EXPANSION OF POLITICAL PARTICIPATION

NEW REPUBLICAN IDEALS ENCOURAGED BROADER PARTICIPATION IN GOVERNANCE, ALTHOUGH SUFFRAGE WAS OFTEN LIMITED BY PROPERTY REQUIREMENTS. THE REVOLUTION FUNDAMENTALLY SHIFTED POLITICAL POWER FROM MONARCHIC TO POPULAR SOVEREIGNTY.
